#### 1. **Spiritual growth by Yoga and Pranayam:**





### Bioactive Compounds in *Trichosanthes cucumerina*, Their Bioactivities, and Associated Health Benefits: A Review

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#### Abstract

*Trichosanthes cucumerina* Linn., commonly known as snake gourd, is a climbing plant belonging to the Cucurbitaceae family, widely grown in tropical and subtropical regions. Traditionally, it has been valued for its nutritional and medicinal properties, with various parts such as the leaves, fruits, seeds, and roots used in folk medicine to address ailments like fever, inflammation, digestive disorders, diabetes, and respiratory problems. ### Greenness Assessment of HPLC-UV Method for Simultaneous Estimation of Four Antihypertensive Drugs

#### Abstract

An environmentally friendly HPLC method was developed to estimate angiotensin receptor blocker (telmisartan) and calcium channel blockers (clindipine, benidipine and azeledipine) in a single run. Separation was achieved using a C18 column (250 mm × 4.6 mm, 5 μm), employing an eluent consisting of 10 mM potassium phosphate buffer (pH 5), methanol and acetonitrile in a ratio of (25:45:30, v/v/v) at 1.0 mL/min flow. Validation of the method was confirmed, following ICH guidelines. Calibration graphs were found to be linear in the ranges of 2.5–40, 0.625–10, 0.5–8 and 1–16 μg/mL corresponding to telmisartan, clindipine, benidipine and azeledipine, respectively. To assess the environmental impact of the method, five greenness evaluation criteria, namely, the Green Analytical Procedure Index, Analytical Greenness, Chlortox Scale, Blue Applicability Grade Index, and Red-Blue-Green 12, were adopted. Concerning all the tools, the proposed method was found to be green.

### Redefining acne treatment: emerging role of probiotics in dermatology

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#### Abstract

Acne is a common dermatological condition that requires novel therapeutic strategies. Probiotics, live microorganisms that confer health benefits, have emerged as a promising option for acne management. This review summarizes current evidence on the role of probiotics, focusing on their ability to modulate the skin microbiota, reduce inflammation, and influence the skin-gut axis. Both oral and topical probiotic applications have shown potential—oral formulations primarily act through gut-skin immune modulation, whereas topical preparations directly target the cutaneous microbiota and local inflammation. Certain strains demonstrate antimicrobial activity against acne-associated bacteria, offering a targeted approach. Their use alongside conventional therapies and the development of topical formulations further expand treatment possibilities. As a personalized and well-tolerated intervention, probiotics have the potential to improve acne outcomes and enhance patients' quality of life. However, clinical evidence is limited by the scarcity of large randomized controlled trials, and further studies are needed to confirm efficacy and optimize treatment protocols. Future research should prioritize strain-specific recommendations, dosage optimization, and integration with precision dermatology.

Simultaneous estimation of Linalool and Eugenol in herbal formulations using a validated RP-HPLC method: A green analytical approach

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#### ABSTRACT

Linalool and Eugenol commonly found in herbal products happen to be major bioactive components because of their anti-inflammatory, antioxidant, as well as antimicrobial properties. The for quality control and standardization of these products, a strong analytical technique that tries to be effective enough is necessary. The current study developed and validated a reversed-phase high performance liquid chromatography method that is sufficiently simple, accurate, and precise. The method quantified combined amounts of Linalool and Eugenol in the herbal formulations. A C18 column that bonded at 2.0 μm was separated chromatographically using acetonitrile and water mobile phase (55:45, v/v). The approach was validated to accordance with ICH Q2(R2) guidelines for parameters like linearity, specificity, LOD, LOQ, robustness, accuracy, and precision. The batch of the analysis with correlation coefficient greater than 0.997, the technique demonstrated a good linearity. This linearity was general between about 2–50 μg/ml. ABBE, DMU, NMR, and GC-MS were used to evaluate the method's generality. Concepts of White Analytical Chemistry (WAC) were brought in using GC-MS, as well as HPLC results. Sustainability, safety, and environmental benefits for each of the method were assessed. The method developed was successfully used to commercial herbal products, proving its applicability in routine quality control purposes.
