Abstract
Trichosanthes cucumerina Linn., commonly known as snake gourd, is a climbing plant belonging to the Cucurbitaceae family, widely grown in tropical and subtropical regions. Traditionally, it has been valued for its nutritional and medicinal properties, with various parts such as the leaves, fruits, seeds, and roots used in folk medicine to address ailments like fever, inflammation, digestive disorders, diabetes, and respiratory problems. The plant is rich in bioactive compounds including flavonoids, alkaloids, saponins, and triterpenoids, which are responsible for its broad spectrum of pharmacological activities such as antioxidants, antimicrobial, antidiabetic, and hepatoprotective effects. In addition, its low caloric value and high nutrient density make it suitable as a functional food. This review discusses the plant's botanical characteristics, phytochemical profile, and pharmacological actions, along with its therapeutic potential and industrial relevance in both pharmaceutical and nutraceutical domains. The study is based on a detailed

Greenness Assessment of HPLC-UV Method for Simultaneous Estimation of Four Antihypertensive Drugs

Abstract
An environmentally friendly HPLC method was developed to estimate angiotensin receptor blocker (telmisartan) and calcium channel blockers (clonidine, benidipine and amlodipine) in a single run. Separation was achieved using a C18 column (250 mm × 4.6 mm, 5 μm), employing an eluent consisting of 10 mM potassium phosphate buffer (pH 5), methanol and acetonitrile in a ratio of (25:45:30, v/v/v) at 1.0 mL/min flow. Validation of the method was confirmed, following ICH guidelines. Calibration graphs were found to be linear in the ranges of 2.5–40, 0.625–10, 0.5–8 and 1–16 μg/mL corresponding to telmisartan, clonidine, benidipine and amlodipine, respectively. To assess the environmental impact of the method, five greenness evaluation criteria, namely, the Green Analytical Procedure Index, Analytical GREeness, Chlortox Scale, Blue Applicability Grade Index, and Red-Blue-Green 12, were adopted. Concerning all the tools, the proposed method was found to be green.

Abstract
Acne is a common dermatological condition that requires novel therapeutic strategies. Probiotics, live microorganisms that confer health benefits, have emerged as a promising option for acne management. This review summarizes current evidence on the role of probiotics, focusing on their ability to modulate the skin microbiota, reduce inflammation, and influence the skin-gut axis. Both oral and topical probiotic applications have shown potential—oral formulations primarily act through gut-skin immune modulation, whereas topical preparations directly target the cutaneous microbiota and local inflammation. Certain strains demonstrate antimicrobial activity against acne-associated bacteria, offering a targeted approach. Their use alongside conventional therapies and the development of topical formulations further expand treatment possibilities. As a personalized and well-tolerated intervention, probiotics have the potential to improve acne outcomes and enhance patients' quality of life. However, clinical evidence is limited by the scarcity of large randomized controlled trials, and further studies are needed to confirm efficacy and optimize treatment protocols. Future research should prioritize strain-specific recommendations, dosage optimization, and integration with precision dermatology.
